

## Greetings from Pastor Ric...

### **“The Four Rules of Helping”**

Let me ask you a question: If somebody showed up on a Sunday morning and after the worship service, shared their story of need and asked for some help. What should we do in response?

This is not just a rhetorical question. I’ve heard of several churches in our county where this very thing has happened. It probably isn’t a matter of “IF” someone comes to ask us for help in their time of need, but “WHEN.” We won’t know in advance when it will happen, but we need to prepare with prayer and discerning discussions about how we can assist in a Christ-like way.

When I was a pastor in downtown Sheboygan, we would often have two or three individuals a week walk into the church office asking for some type of assistance: some needed rent money to avoid eviction, some needed medicine but couldn’t afford the cost, some needed a gas card or food until their next payday. I wanted to help, my heart was touched by their stories and their needs, but after they left, I would ask myself: “Did I really help them?”

I was not always sure I had helped. Especially, when I would see them back again later for other needs or the same one. I felt that I wasn’t addressing their ‘core issues’ of need in my all-too-brief interaction.

These feelings again washed over me recently when I read a short column by Rebekah Simon-Peter in a Ministry Matters email. She shared about a clergy couple who came up with the Four Rules of Helping. They wrestled with the same feelings that the people who came for help weren’t really being helped. The money and the food assisted them temporarily, but their baseline situation never changed appreciably. The pastors knew that they wanted the church’s efforts to make a difference, so they would have to do something different. Here are their four rules for helping as a church leader:

- 1. The person has to need help.**
- 2. The person has to want help.**
- 3. The person has to want *my* help.**
- 4. I can only help them to help themselves.**

When the pastors and their congregation moved away from quick fixes, they landed upon the kind of vision that met all the Four Rules of Helping criteria. Their vision became, “**Equipping people to thrive.**” I love this vision because it’s easy to remember, is biblical, and offers so much more than a quick fix. She wanted people to see themselves in a new light: as new creations in Christ, as capable, confident, able, worthy human beings. People who had what it takes to rise to new heights.

So, how do we stop ‘helping’ and start ‘empowering’ others? I welcome your ideas and prayers about this important issue to inform us to respond in ways that really help our neighbors in need.

**May this season of Easter be the time when we can remind everyone of the importance of Empowerment in their lives!**
